1. How to use the 'HHFS' website

To find the HHFS website type <http://www.hhfs.org.uk> in the address bar of your browser as shown below:

Welcome to the Hagley Historical and Field Society. We meet once a month at St Saviour's Church Hall. Please see the calendar for both meeting and outing dates.

The Society was formed at an inaugural meeting on July 31st 1963. Its objectives were to further the knowledge of local history, encourage local research, arrange discussions and outings and generally explore the past. The first event that the Society held was a visit to Buildwas Abbey. The Society has continued to follow and expand on its initial objectives and has meetings, visits, historical walks and social events, as detailed in the programme calendar. Visitors are always welcome to our events; many later become members of the society.

The annual subscription is £10.00. Visitors are always welcome to our meetings at £2.00 per visit



In due course there may be a 'video' gallery which will operate in a similar manner.



Emails can also be sent to the Society in the normal way by using the address 'mail@hhfs.org.uk' as a 'send to'.

Prior to clicking on 'Send' you are asked to enter the four characters visible above the 'send' box. In this example the characters are BS8E. This is to protect the Society from being bombarded by unsolicited emails from automated 'spam' generators.



The 'Directions' window can be closed by clicking the blue cross to reveal the whole map. If you hold down the left mouse button on the map, you can move the map with the mouse. You can click on a [month](#) under 'By Month', a [subject](#) under 'by Subject' or a particular [post](#) under 'Most Recent Posts'.


After opening a post you can return to the original page by clicking on the 'Archives' link again.

11. Opening documents and increasing text size

Many of the documents on this site are held in a format which requires Adobe Acrobat to be installed on your computer. Sometimes when you open such a document it appears too large to view conveniently. If you click on the icon below it will change the display to view one page at a time.



Where possible the size each document is shown in Megabytes (MB). At typical broadband speeds currently available in Hagley you can expect it to take around 5 seconds per MB to open a document.

Changing the text size in your web browser:

If, when viewing a page you find the text is too small, use the 'View' option on your browser tool bar to increase or reduce (Zoom In/Out) the text size as shown below:
