The Idea of a Cummunity

Centre.

So many sciences, studies and virtues - politics, civics, sociology, charity, to name only a few - bear on the art of living happily and usefullyin a community. We must, for our very survival, succeed in getting along well with our neighbours, and all the big problems of the. world, industrial dissension, international tension, social jealousy and misunderstanding, deprived and underprivileged classes, racial or religious discrimination, only underline man's weakness in the practice of this social virtue.

Most of us would obnsider that all these things are rather mider than our immediate lives, and that they are the concern of someone else. Yet more and more we are coming to realise that this question of charity does in fact begin with ourselves in our own circles, domestic and social, and that the usual solution of mixing only with close friends and with business acquaintances is not helping to widen the sphere of "getting on" with other people. To many, the war had a revolutionary effect on social relations, and the business of fighting for one's life roke down barriers of race, class, and creed to an extent to which it and never been thought possible.

The Government of this country is based upon a system of community of interests, where groups of people with different interests wake their points of view felt. On most issues, the majortiy of people are completely indifferent: only an enthusiastic few carry the position, and others wonder at their energy.

The obvious conclusion from all this is that in a residential area as diverse in constitution as Hagley, a community centre can serve a splendid and constructive social purpose. Broadly, it can serve as a club, where people can foregather and meet others on an equal footing: wore specifically, it can offer accommodation for all those activities mich appeal to a small group, and in this way can make those interests an accepted contribution to the life of the village instead of being an ecentricity. The diversity can be unified by the idea of a Community Centre, and everyone's life becomes the fuller for its presence.

THE HAGLEY YOUNG WIVES! GROUP.

What is the Young Wives' Group? And why does it exist? Your Editor kindly asked me to write a few lines about the above Group and I am glad to be able to do this. Of course, many of you will already know of our existence and many of you will already be members,

The Hagley Young Wives' Group is a Church organisation existing to cultivate a sense of friendship between young married people based on the important Commandment, Love of God and Love of Neighbour. We believe that you can't really carry out the second part of the Command without understanding the first part: and we also believe that without a meaningful relationship to God other relationships will not have real meaning. With that very firmly to the forefront we manage to run a very successful organisation.

Our meetings are held on the second Tuesday in each month at 7.45 pm. in the Church Hall, and afternoon meetings are held at fortnight after an evening meeting at 2.00pm. in the Church Hall. We also run a Study Group, a Drama Group and an Art Group. We have Theatre Trips, (Usually two a year), and all our members are divided into small groups under the care of a Committee Member, through whom baby-sitting arrangements and Home-help system can probably be arranged, where necessary. In this way it is possible to get to know a small group of people fairly well. We have a membership of between 70 and 80 and we pay 2/-d per year subscription.

In November we have Lord Cobham coming to talk on The History of Hagley Hall and The Church. In December a Probation Officer is talking on her work. Also in December we have a trip to the Belgrade Theatre in Coventry.

You would be very welcome. Do come along.

HAGLEY PARISH COUNCIL.

The Parish Council at their last meeting concurred with the Petition from the residents of the Titford Estate, sent to the Minister of Housing and Local Government, regarding the continued obnoxious smell from the Schage Plant and a letter from the Council has been sent to the Ministry, supporting the complaint. It asked for early action to eliminate the nuisance. The Council are also suggesting to Bromsgrove Council that thros are planted as a wind-break round the Sewage Plant to temporarily minimise the nuisance.

The Council would like to remind residents of the Notice at the entrance from the Station to the Playing Fields which states that this is not a Right of Way and must not be regarded as a short cut to and from the Railway Station.

The Let's do a Play Club is not a recent innovation. Our first play was performed more than eighteen years ago and last year we had the pleasure of celebrating our fifticth production.

We are also proud of the fact that we have always received sufficient support to keep ourselves activent by the sale of tickets for our shows without resorting to other money raising schemes. In fact more than £250 has been contributed to charities since we began. Last year £23 was donated to the Freedom from Hunger Campaign.

As fas as our resources will permit we try to give varied types of play which will cover all tastes. There are usually four productions during the winter season, each play being given for three nights.
