#### THE IDEA OF A COMMUNITY CENTRE IN HAGLEY.

In the old days Hagley was a small village — and a community. Its inhabitants were bound together by a common interest in their occupation which was generally agriculture and they had their natural leaders and centre.

Today the pattern of life has changed and Hagley is a dormitory for commuters, the majority of whom have moved from other areas. The result tends to be a community with few common ties and no centre.

A conscious effort has therefore to be made to supply these things and answer is the Community Centre. This is a place where people may meet for reation and to engage in the activities that interest them. It provides a point for the district, and most important it fosters a sense of community good citizenship.

This therefore seems to me to be an idea which deserves the support of largey people, especially those with children to bring up.

Equally, it should be supported by local organisations, even those whose mises are sufficient for their own needs. An organisation owes a duty to the community in which it exists and not just to its own members. It will also be any stimulation of interest in local affairs.

Organisations and individuals not connected with the Community Association give the matter serious thought.
