The N.F.C.A. publishes a Community News Bulletin three times a year and a Year Book.

The Hagley Community Association has already received a great deal of help and information from the N.F.C.A. and will make full use of all the facilities offered by the Federation.

After the descent by another route and a hike around the district, the remainder of the night (or morning) was spent in a wooden hut at the foot of the Wrekin, by kind permission of the Shropshire Scouts.

Our traditional Boxing Day Hike, this being the 36th., will this year take place over Brown Clee Hills and the day will be completed by the equally traditional evening meal, prepared by a small group of parents.

#### HAGLEY PARISH COUNCIL.

Sewage Disposal Plant. The Council hope to call a Public Meeting early in the New Year so that the report of the Consultant Engineers of the Bromsgrove R.D.C. may be explained to the residents. Unfortunately this Meeting cannot be arranged for the 20th January as reported in the Press.

It is again emphasised by the Ministry of Transport that Lighting Authorities, who have kept their street Lights on all night during the Christmas Period have made a valuable contribution to Road Safety. The Council have therefore agreed that the street lamps in the Main Roads should be kept lighted all night from the 23rd December to the end January, inclusive.

The Council are investigating the possibility of extending the Pavillion in the Playing Fields by removing the stores to another building and to take in the present store space to make an addition to the Changing Room with a connecting door.

#### HAGLEY HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY.

Meeting on December 11th. The Society was greatly entertained by most amusing extracts from the Parish Records of Beoley, near Redditch, selected and read by the Rector, The Rev. E.N.JUDGE. The Extracts were taken from the Account Books of the Church Wardens, Overseer, and Petty Constable between the years 1566 and 1788. The details given gave a vivid picture of the life of Beoley at that time, and were a stimulus to the Society to try to recreate the past in Hagley.
